Undertake CAT4 and NGRT Reading Tests to diagnose the specific strengths and weaknesses of each pupil to help ensure they receive the correct additional support through interventions.	The CAT4 is similar to an IQ test and gives a snapshot of a pupil's potential, more so than traditional, curriculum- based tests. It identifies learning preferences and helps teachers to see which pupils will need assistance and support, as well as those who need to be challenged. NGRT reading tests give a breakdown of students reading ability, including comprehension which allows teachers to identify which part of reading is a particular challenge for each child. This allows staff to develop specific intervention to ensure the student makes progress.	CAT4 and NGRT testing now forms part of the assessment calendar. All Year 11 students took age appropriate CAT4 tests with Year 10 testing in the Autumn Term 2024. NGRT tests have been conducted for all Year groups in the Autumn term 2023/2024.
All Behaviour (positive and negative) communicated to parents, carers.	Introduction of Satchel One,	The implementation of the updated Behaviour Policy and procedures has led to improved communication with parents/carers. With the introduction of Satchel One, parents/carers can now see all positive and negative behaviour incidents via their own Satchel One login. This is also followed up with phone calls from staff where appropriate.
