Careers at Ormiston Park Academy

Uni Connect Project:

Designed for Year 9 students, the aim of this six-week programme (5 taught sessions in school, plus 1 HEI campus visit) is to give learners an opportunity to learn and develop metacognition through self-regulated learning, using a focus of careers, pathways and Labour Market Information (LMI) content. The programme is designed for the skills learnt to be transferred across curriculum subjects. Carefully designed guided practice, with support gradually withdrawn as the pupil becomes proficient, can allow pupils to develop skills and strategies before applying them in independent practice.

On completion of this programme learners have an increased ability to:

- Ask questions
- Organise thinking
- Make connections between ideas
- Link concepts
- Generate hypotheses
- Edit and review work

The 30 Year 9 students had a fantastic day at the University of Essex, putting their newly acquired skills into practice whilst learning about University life.









Careers Carousel

On 29th January, the whole of Year 9 were involved in our first Careers Carousel, where four different employers came in to do a mini workshop with students. The employers talked about the different roles in their industry, pathways into employment (including apprenticeships) and the educational requirements needed to be successful.

The Department for Work and Pensions, The Army, The Royal Opera House and Sternberg Reed Solicitors were fantastic guests and imparted a huge amount of valuable information to our students.
