The response was universally positive, with students saying they got a greater understanding of the text and that they were enthralled by the excellent performances.

There was even a chance for the director to come on stage afterwards and take some questions from the audience, who were eager to question her on the artistic choices that had been made with the retelling of the Dickens classic. Student behaviour was universally excellent, with the director telling us afterwards that the OPA children were a "credit to us all". Some Year 11 students went backstage at the end of the performance to thank the actors personally on the enjoyable event. Others said that they had acquired a desire to take more theatre trips in the future.

The visit comes with OPA's renewed focus on enrichment and ensuring children have opportunities to have memorable experiences outside of the classroom.

We have run a Christmas card competition with the top three entries included below. Congratulations to the winners and very well done to all that entered




Christmas Card Competition
